right of lien of degree of student against the loan amount which is legally not permissible to any University.

The Commission hereby directs the petitioner to apply the no dues form in the respondent university and the university is directed to release the original MD degree of the complainant, if all dues are cleared. The loan amount cannot be considered as amount due in respect of university and is separate issue which needs to separately dealt under any other provision of law.

Hence nothing survived in the matter and the same is disposed off.
